

J.M. Davis Arms and Historical Museum is the world's largest privately-owned gun collection with over 50,000 artifacts including steins, statuaries, World War 1 posters and so much more. You can see where the grand collection began in the lobby of the Mason Hotel inside the museum. Be sure to grab a group photo with the tank outside, weather permitting of course. (allow 1 hour)

Dklahoma Military Academy Museum on the grounds of Rogers State University—the Oklahoma Military Academy Museum tells the story of the more than 10,000 cadets who attended from 1919 to 1971. The museum collects, preserves, and exhibits items relevant to the school's history including a recreated typical cadet room and a bust of <u>Lt. Gen. William E. Potts</u> who is the highest-ranking alumnus of OMA. OMA created a proud heritage having served the state and nation for 52 years. (allow 1 hour)

Oklahoma's favorite son, Will Rogers, called Claremore home and we honor his life at the **Will Rogers Memorial Museum** through numerous exhibits, artifacts, movies, and events at the museum every day. Join "Will Rogers" for a tour, wit, and rope tricks during your groups visit. (allow 1.5 to 2 hours)

Lunch at Hammett House, a Claremore tradition known for the chicken fried steak and mile high pie. Be sure to eat dessert first! (allow 1 to 1.5 hours)

Driving Tour of Tulsa Port of Catoosa-June 5, 1971, President Richard M. Nixon officially dedicated the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS) and the Tulsa Port of Catoosa in a historic and memorable visit. The Port is the furthest inland port in the United States and is a 2,500-acre industrial park, barge port and rail transload facility with 71 existing companies employing over 2,600 Oklahomans. Plan a driving tour through the port with a member of Port Authority as the step on guide. (allow 1.5 hours)
